Pledge of Allegiance

The Military Salute is used when reciting the Pledge of Allegiance and during the playing or singing of the National Anthem.

"I pledge allegiance to the flag, of the United States of America, and to the republic for which it stands, one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all"

The Potentate or designated individual will cause the Nobility to come to attention and salute at the proper time.

With the audience standing silently facing the platform the color bearer, followed by escort, marches to the front and faces the audience. Escorts take positions on either side of the Flag bearer. The audience may then recite the pledge of allegiance and sing the national anthem. Flag bearer places Flag in its stand. Audience is seated. Flag detail departs.

At the Ceremonial the MDB donation was \$5,000 and the Sauerkrauts \$7,235.





Hospital Committee Report

ACCA Business Meeting 11.15.16

We are still sending children currently, to 11 different Hospitals. The full time screening clinic being held at Dr. Richard Redman's office is producing screenings with applications forwarded to the appropriate Shrine Hospitals. The Richmond Follow-up Clinic seems to be progressing slowly. There is also a Prototype Telemedicine Clinic that has begun operation in Danville for our Philadelphia Hospital.

Expenses this year are anticipated to be in the range of \$55,000 to \$65,000, consequently, we can use some funds in the Transportation Fund before the end of the year, otherwise we will start 2017 with under \$40,000 and that is a really low amount to start the year. It will only take a couple of emergency air ambulance charges to deplete the account. We have a number of kids going to the Boston Hospital and one in particular is going several times a month. We are trying to get air miles from Tampa or charitable flights which have not worked to date, so we are sending the child and guardian commercially.

Average cost per month, YTD, is \$ 4,564. We currently have 22 Shrine Drivers and 6 Ladies with several members and their ladies working on their paperwork. We have had 60 trips with 64 patients, through October. Trips YTD is 6% below 2015. Thanks to all of the drivers for allowing us to take care of our shrine kids and stepping up to drive for last minute trips. All of our air flights are to Boston or Cincinnati so far this year, and are both Charitable and Commercial flights. One patient has previously had to go monthly although it has slowed down a bit now and is a little farther between appointments but we have picked up a second child transferred to our area by Tampa and their trips are very frequent.

As mentioned numerous times before, the Hospital Policy and associated documents have been revised with the changes approved by the Board of Directors at the end of 2015, as stated previously and remember that we can now have Master Masons as a driver when paired with a shrine driver. Nobles please talk to your Units, Clubs and Blue Lodges about this. It can be a "winwin", whereby we can possible get new shriners from this program....and we certainly need these as well as drivers.

We still need additional drivers (both Nobles and their Ladies. Please consider driving for the Transportation Team. Ralph Heard would like to have more drivers to choose from. We have lost some of our drivers due to aging out, illness or family illness...and please take this back to your Unit and Club Membership and mention it. Have them contact Ralph or myself if they are interested.

If you would like to help the Hospital Committee, the meetings are held the first Tuesday night of each month at 7:30pm in the Trophy Room and are open to all Nobles and their Ladies. You are welcome and encouraged to participate.

The Shriners Hospitals for Children Orthopaedics Clinic at Niswonger Children's Hospital in Johnson City, Tennessee opened October 3, 2016.







Petersburg Shrine Club


The Petersburg Shrine Club has held 2 meetings since the last Accalette. Both of the meetings were held at the Colonial Heights Moose Lodge.

The Christmas, Ladies Night and Installation of Officers dinner will be held on December 9, 2016 in the Assembly room at





Shriners Hospitals for Children – Philadelphia Celebrates 90 years of Caring for Kids

Looking for holiday gift ideas? Make a contribution to Shriners Hospitals for Children in honor of the person for whom you're looking for gift ideas.

I bring you Christmas and Holiday greetings from the Board and staff of Shriners Hospitals for Children – Philadelphia (SHC-P) and wish for each of you a joyous Holiday with your family and friends.

2016 has been a year of transition and growth for SHC-P. Thanks got to our physicians and staff for their drive and initiative as well as to our Board and all Shriners and their families and friends for making this happen. Compared with 2015:

- The number of new patients has increased by 20%.
- Surgeries have increased by 11%. We are also, upon request, sending our physicians to assist with complex surgeries at our Hospitals in Greenville, Springfield and Tampa.
- The Fracture Clinic which started two years ago has experienced a 125% increase this year.
- The Motion Analysis Laboratory has experienced a 60% increase in the number of patients seen.

The head of SHC-P Rehabilitation Programs is Stephanie Lipa, MD. She has recently passed her Brain Traumatic Injury Boards and now will be able to treat orthopaedic patients with associated spasticity. SHC-P could not provide care for these patients in the past.

SHC-P has been designated as one of the pilot hospitals to implement a Telehealth Program. Telehealth is a form of videoconferencing, allowing the patient, a family member and a medical professional at a site away from the hospital to talk with the patient's SHC-P physician in real time. It's another initiative to help us find and serve new patients and at the same time, make it more convenient for the child and his family. The University of Puerto Rico Pediatric Hospital and here in VA, the Danville Orthopaedic and Athletic Rehabilitation Center are the pilot organizations with whom we are working. You'll hear much more about this in the future.

Work is continuing to simplify the patient referral process at SHC-P. All it takes is one call to our patient line 215-430-4140. Referrals are welcome from any source, Shriners, parents and medical professionals. Once we receive a referral our patient intake coordinator will contact the family in one or two business days. When appropriate, appointments will be made and written confirmation sent to the families. We are committed to doing all we can to improve the lives of children in our care.

This will be my final article for the Accalette as a member of the SHC-P Board of Governors. I will move the Emeritus status at the end of this year. It has been an honor for me to serve as an Acca representative. Thank you all for allowing me to serve.

Noble Dan Freye was recommended by the SHC-P Board of Governors and he has been appointed to the Board along with a Noble from LuLu Shrine by the Board of Trustees to fill two vacancies. Noble David Eells will continue to serve as an Associate Member. I congratulate both of them for their interest and wish them well.

The city of Philadelphia is known for having a full history of firsts.



The first art museum, university, medical school, zoo, escalator, department store, U.S. Mint, and the list could go on about all of the first places and things that have occurred in the great city of Brotherly Love. Philadelphia is also home to the world's first Ronald McDonald House. Co-founded by Audrey Evans, M.D. (a pediatric oncologist at The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia) and Jimmy Murray (former general manager of the

Philadelphia Eagles), the Philadelphia Ronald McDonald House opened on October 15, 1974 and now serves as the model for over 350 Houses in 42 countries.

Shriners Hospitals for Children - Philadelphia has had a long-standing relationship with the Philadelphia Ronald McDonald House at the Front and Erie location, where many of our patients stay. This year, the Philadelphia Ronald McDonald House charities introduced its Champions of Hope Awards, which highlights other local individuals that embody the same dream, determination and commitment to children and families as the co-founders, Dr. Audrey Evans and Jim Murray.

The inaugural event chose to honor Scott Kozin, M.D., chief of staff, Philadelphia Shriners Hospital, with the Dr. Audrey E. Evans Award of Excellence. The Jim Murray Community Leadership Award went to Suzanne Root, Esq.

Shriners Hospitals for Children is grateful and proud to work with the Ronald McDonald House Charities of Philadelphia.

Here is an excerpt of the speech that Dr. Kozin gave at the

It is a privilege and honor to receive the Audrey Evans Award of Excellence tonight. Shriners Hospitals for Children and Ronald McDonald House are a perfect symbiotic relationship. We are all stronger by collaboration. Collaboration allows us to care for more children, better their lives and maintain family unity. Our relationship with Ronald McDonald house has grown over the last 20 years. Our hospital here in Philadelphia cares for children from around the United States and the globe. Notably, last year we cared for children from 48 out of the 50 states. The ability for us to care for these children could not be possible without the facilities and care at the Ronald McDonald House. Time has resulted in many changes in health care that make it increasingly difficult to keep patients in the hospital. Daily, weekly and monthly we search for alternative housing during their stay in Philadelphia. Surgery is just part of the treatment with rehabilitation being equally important. Many of our patients are severely impaired and require intensive rehabilitation before and after surgery. It is unpractical for them to fly back and forth or drive back and forth hours and hours to and from their home to Philadelphia. Housing them in Ronald McDonald House, a place filled with love and compassion, is the perfect solution for children and for their families.

Children and families' experiences at the Ronald McDonald House are remarkable and memorable. The families are indebted to the care and compassion demonstrated in the area. Families have become friends at the Ronald McDonald House and frequently coordinate their stays at the house so that their children and they can be more comfortable and cared for during their treatment at Shriners Hospitals for Children. None of this could have been possible without the drive and vision of Dr. Evans.

In closing, I am humbled by receiving this award. The Annual Business Session will be held at ACCA Shrine, 1712 Bellevue Avenue, Richmond, Virginia, at 7:30 P.M., Tuesday, January 17, 2017. The Annual Election of Officers for the year 2017 and Representatives to the Imperial Council Session has to begin not later than 9:00 P.M., according to the Imperial Council By-Laws and Code. During the meeting, the Annual Reports of Trustees, Potentate, Treasurer and Recorder will be given.

The attention of the Nobility is directed to the following excerpts from the By-Laws and Code of the Imperial Council concerning the procedure of election of officers:

ARTICLE 25 OFFICERS: THEIR ELECTION OR APPOINTMENT

Sec. 325.5 Ballot.

(a) Separate Ballot. Election of officers shall be by a majority vote of those present and voting. When there is more than one candidate for election to a particular office, a separate written ballot is required. A blanket ballot is prohibited.

Sec. 325.6 Time of election. Nominations must commence not later than 9:00 p.m. and when that hour arrives all other business must cease and none may be transacted until the election is concluded.

Sec. 325.7 Other Officers. The Temple may elect such other officers as its bylaws provide.

Sec. 325.8 Nomination. Candidates for office and Representative must be placed in nomination from the floor.

Sec. 325.10 Representatives.

(a) Single Ballot. Where a Temple elects more than one Representative, all candidates must be balloted for on one written ballot.

(b) Complete Ballot. Each member voting must vote only for the total number of Representatives to be elected, otherwise his ballot cannot be counted as a vote.

(c) Majority Vote. A majority vote of those present and voting is necessary to elect each Representative.

(d) Election. Only those candidates who receive a majority vote shall be declared elected.

(e) Successive Ballots. Successive written ballots must then be taken in the same manner on other candidates until all Representatives are elected.

(f) Highest Vote. If more candidates receive a majority vote than the number of representatives to be elected, then those receiving the greatest number of votes shall be declared elected.

(g) Void Ballots. Blank ballots or ballots containing any markings other than the name of a candidate nominated from the floor are not votes and are not to be considered for any purpose.

Sec. 325.11 Election Regulations.

(a) Electioneering. A candidate for an elected office in a Shrine temple may print, publish and circulate during the year he is seeking the elected office, a resume consisting of his educational background, his vocational history, and his Masonic and Shrine record. Except as provided in the prior sentence, the priming, publication, circulating or distribution of resolutions, letters telegrams, tickets, email or other devices, by a unit, club, Noble, or group of Nobles, suggesting, recommending, opposing or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the temple is prohibited.

(b) Expenditures Prohibited. The expenditure of money for gifls, favors, or entertainment on behalf of a candidate for elected office is prohibited.

(c) Violation. For any violation of (a) or (b), the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officers void and order a new election.

(d) Notice. At least one week prior to the annual meeting or any election, the temple Recorder shall mail to each member a notice thereof containing this section.

Sec. 326.3 Installation.

(a) Date and Ritual. The officers shall be installed during the month of January at a temple or public ceremony as prescribed by temple resolution. Such installation shall be in accordance with the ceremony of installation prescribed by Shriners International.

(b) Duties. They shall assume the duties of their respective offices upon installation

ARTICLE 39 VISITORS TO TEMPLES

Sec. 339.1 Admission. A Noble may not be admitted to his own or any other temple, unless he exhibits to the temple to which he desires admittance an official Shrine card for the then current year.
