From The Recorder's Pen



This is going to be an exciting year for our Temple. Ill. Sir Dennis Berry has outlined a very progressive agenda for this year, and the budget was approved at our January business meeting. You will see a substantial change in the indoor appearance of our Temple, as well as some internal ways of doing business, which will not be so apparent. We have upgraded our computer systems and financial software to bring them up to current standards. This will improve communications with you and simplify our accounting system. All of these progressive changes are for our benefit, and will bring us up to the standards of the 21st century. I think the Nobility will be quite pleased with the results.



We had a net loss of 57 members in 2017. We need to continue to focus on the addition of new members. This can only be done through your efforts at your Blue Lodge.

We are emphasizing increased rentals of our facilities this year for the additional revenue it will generate. Contracts are being rewritten and fees re-evaluated. There is great interest in our facilities from outside sources. I think it will become even more attractive to renters when we

Please let the office know of any dates you need as soon as you can. The sooner, the better. Chief Rabban Ed Ernouf is starting to work on the schedule for 2019 and needs all Unit and Club leaders to contact him with known specific dates for 2019 that need to be reserved.

One last request. If you need something done or have payments to be made, please call, email or come by the office. Please do not request something to be done, or give me checks, at social functions. After about four or five requests, I can't keep them straight, and I don't want to miss something or not have a payment applied properly.





Philadelphia Hospital Report

The Board of Governors meeting was held at Shriners Hospitals for Children – Philadelphia on March 15, 2018. We were honored to have Imperial Sir Jerry Gantt, President of Shriners Hospitals for Children and Chairman of the Board of Trustees; Illustrious Sir Jim Doel, Trustee Liaison; and John McCabe, Executive Vice President & Chief Operating Officer, join us. Hospital operations are off to a good start for 2018. Surgical volume is up 3 procedures over 2017, and while February numbers weren't available due to our meeting being held earlier than normal, net expenses are up 7.7% and receipts are up 6.6%. Dr. Scot Kozin, Chief of Staff, reported that Dr. Dan Zlotolow was recognized as a Philadelphia "Top Doc", a noteworthy peer reviewed distinction. Ed Myers, Hospital Administrator, announced the permanent appointment of Krista Miller, RN, as Director of Patient Care Services. She had been filling the position on an interim appointment since December 2016 while pursuing her Masters in Nursing.

The hospital had 4 new patients referred by Acca in February; 4 total year to date.

Following the board meeting, we were joined by the boards of the Erie, Boston, Springfield, and Montreal hospitals for a day and a half long Local Governance Conference. This was the first regional hospital board training conference put on by the Governance Institute and Shriners Hospitals for Children (SHC) headquarters. We heard presentations on Governance Best Practices and proposed SHC regulation changes. We also spent much time discussing the changing landscape of healthcare, how current trends in healthcare relate to SHC, and strategies to make SHC sustainable. The presentations were outstanding and it was great to socialize with our counterparts from the other hospitals and home office.

Noble Dave Eells and I have also been busy here at home. Worshipful and Noble Steve Beverly invited me to speak to Joppa Lodge #40's stated communication on March 1. The topic was the history of Shriners International and evolution of Shriners Hospitals for Children. At the conclusion of the evening, the Lodge

presented me with a \$500 check for the Philadelphia Hospital. Thank you, Joppa Brothers! We'll be looking for petitions now!

On Saturday night, March 7, Dave and I were guest judges at the Glen Allen High School "Battle of the Classes". The Battle was held in remembrance of two Glen Allen students, Chase Ingram and Britlyn Weinstock, who passed away earlier this school year. Each class chose a theme, designed their own T-shirts, decorated a corner of the gym, performed a group dance number, and competed in goofy games. It was a super fun evening! Half of the proceeds from the event will be donated in memory of Britlyn, a former patient, to Shriners Hospitals for Children-Philadelphia.

There are several upcoming events worthy of noting. First, the Philadelphia Hospital has been given 100 tickets to the Monster Energy NASCAR Cup Series race in Dover, Delaware, on May 6. We're hoping to have all 100 seats filled by Nobles and their ladies, patients and their families, and donors. There will be an opportunity to meet driver Noble David Ragan who will be driving the No. 38 Shriners Hospitals for Children Ford Fusion! Second, June 21 is Expanded Board Day. There will be tours of the hospital, presentations, and you'll get to meet some great Shrine kids and their families. If you'd like to attend either event, please let Noble Dave or I know. Finally, we are actively planning our Second Annual Walk for Love. We will be asking all units and clubs to participate in making the 2018 Walk even better than last year's. Become a sponsor, form a team, put on a unit demonstration, or just come out and walk. Please put September 29 on your calendars!

Shriners International

Name Reflects International Importance

Back in 1872, when the Shriners fraternity was established, it made perfect sense to emphasize the middle-Eastern motif of the organization by naming it the Ancient Arabic Order of the Nobles of the Mystic Shrine.

While the fraternity is still based on fun, fellowship and the Masonic principles of brotherly love, relief and truth, neither that tongue-twisting formal name – nor even the more commonly-used name of Shriners of North America – fit the organization today.

Today, there are active members of the fraternity located around the world, and an increasing effort to reach and recruit new members on an international scale. It is important they be acknowledged in the name of the organization.

Consequently, at the 2010 Imperial Session in Toronto a resolution was passed to officially replace the corporate name, The Imperial Council of the Ancient Arabic Order of the Nobles of the Mystic Shrine for North America. The resolution also stated that Shriners International should replace the name or any abbreviated versions of it (such as Shriners of North America). Nobles are encouraged to use Shriners International when referring to the fraternity, both in speech and in any temple publications they produce.

Also, just as a reminder, at the 2002 Imperial Session, a proposal to replace the word 'temple' with the word 'Shriners,' when the term is used as a proper name for a group of nobles was passed. For example, Mecca Temple is now Mecca Shriners. The word temple can still be used to designate general groups of Shriners, or the building where Shriners often gather. For example, a correct

use of the word temple would be, 'there are now nearly 200 temples located in the U.S., Canada, Mexico, the Republic of Panama, Philippines and Germany'. Another example would be, 'the temples provide many activities for their members'.

Whether we are attracting interest and members globally or locally, we want to be sure we make it as easy as possible for potential Shriners to understand who we are and what we do. Therefore, it was also decided that when speaking to or providing materials for non-Shriners, it is fine to refer to a temple with a secondary references of 'chapter', which is also a clear indication that we are a fraternity.

All of these changes are part of an overarching effort to increase membership by using terms people everywhere can understand, accept and respond to in a positive way. Additional efforts include the website beashrinernow. com, which is specifically for potential new members.

The future of the fraternity depends on increasing membership. While these efforts are important, it is also imperative that every Shriner be willing to share his interest in and commitment to the fraternity and its philanthropy with those around him.
