

Greenville Hospital Report

The Greenville Hospital has recovered from the Covid pandemic and is once again functioning at pre-Covid levels. The mandate by Tampa in February that all nonvaccinated personnel would be terminated resulted in a loss of about one fourth of the employees, covering all departments. This resulted in a big slowdown of all services, but that is now corrected.

Three satellite clinics are once more open and sending patients to the hospital.

Our telehealth program developed during Covid is now the fourth busiest in the system and covers our six-state referral area. The volume of patients in this program continues to expand.

Bill Munley, our Administrator, is very aggressive regarding referral systems. The hospital has joined multiple large referral groups and now has several thousand physicians outside the Shrine system referring patients with pediatric orthopedic problems directly to the hospital. Total numbers are not yet available, but the number of referrals increases monthly.

The Tampa hospital has closed, which leaves Greenville as the only Shriner facility in the southeast United States. Those Tampa patients were initially sent to Shreveport, but many are now being seen in Greenville. It appears as that volume will increase in the future.

Dr. Wattenbarger, our Chief of Staff, and a team of nurses recently returned from a trip to El Salvador. This

trip was specifically to train physicians there to do some spine procedures rather than bringing the patients back to the US for surgery. Other Shrine hospitals have started similar programs. This saves a mountain of paperwork with government agencies and allows the patient's family to be with them, which is usually not the case when the child is brought to the US. This program is in its infancy, and it will be interesting to see how it progresses over the next several years.

ACCA is very fortunate to have members on the Board of two of the top performing hospitals in the Shrine system. I would like to encourage anyone who hasn't visited one of the hospitals to do so, particularly our new Nobles. It will certainly make you more aware of our purpose as Shriners. Each of the hospitals has a program once a year with tours of the hospital and presentations by some of the patients. These dates will be announced well ahead of the programs.

We are also in dire need of Roadrunners to transport the children to and from the hospitals. Please contact Bill Ferguson or the ACCA office for more information if you are interested.

Ill Sir Dennis Berry and I thank you for allowing us to represent ACCA on the Board of Governors at Shriners Children's -Greenville.

Philadelphia Hospital Report

Daniel L. Freye, Chairman - Board of Governors - Philadelphia

Greetings from Philadelphia! 2022 was a great year for Shriners Children's Philadelphia and 2023 promises to be even better!

This year saw the official establishment of the Northeast Market. Comprised of Shriners Children's locations in Philadelphia, Boston, Northeast (Springfield), and Erie. The market concept was developed to explore areas for collaboration, consolidation and general efficiencies. So far, a Market Development Director has been hired and information technology has been centralized. Plans are underway for the creation of Market Directors of Finance and Human Resources positions. We are currently interviewing candidates for a Market Administrator who will have overall responsibility for the four locations.

The highlight of 2022 were the celebrations of the 150th anniversary of Shriners International and the 100th anniversary of Shriners Hospitals for Children. On September 16, Shriners Hospitals were celebrated on Good Morning America, with several of our board members prominently featured wearing their fezzes in Times Square! On November 12, the Celebration of the Century was held at the Minute Maid Park in Houston, Texas. The highlight of the evening was a concert by Country Music Award-Winner, Singer-Songwriter Dierks Bently. The Philadelphia BOG sponsored a patient family "Champion Couple" to attend the event.

Closer to home, the Doylestown clinic continues to grow as we are now staffed by a physician five days a week. Volume for the past several months has been 70 patients per month, half of them being new to the Shrine system. We are already seeing referrals based on the excellent Shrine care these "new" kids have received.

After a two year delay caused by hurricanes and COVID, the Puerto Rico outreach clinic is being planned for February, 2023. This clinic has been a semi-annual event for the Philadelphia team since 1964 and we are excited to reconnect with those patients and their families.

As reported in the last issue, Shriners Hospitals for Children-Springfield transitioned to an outpatient

clinic under the new name, Shriners Children's New England. Our leadership team has been actively coordinating patient referrals and assisting with medical staff and administrative needs. Like our Puerto Rico experience, Springfield has a long history of providing outreach clinics to Cyprus. That tradition will continue in January through the collaboration of the Northeast Market and the Greenville hospital. Philadelphia's Spine team will be represented at the week-long Cyprus clinic by Dr. Samdani and Nurse Manager Jen Sanceciz. Shriners Children's Greenville will be representing Orthopedics and Boston will be representing Plastics. In addition to seeing patients for multiple clinic days, the physicians will also be participating in physician education, a U.S. Embassy reception, interviews and a meeting at Parliament, and a tour of the Archbishop Makarios III Hospital. The clinic is being hosted by Paraskevaides Foundation and the Cyprus Ministry of Health.

It wouldn't be a Philadelphia Hospital report if I didn't recognize our exceptional surgeons. Dr.

Steven Hwang has received the Scoliosis Research Society (SRS) Traveling Fellowship for 2023.

This prestigious annual traveling fellowship sponsors three SRS fellows to visit major spinal deformity centers under the guidance of a senior SRS fellow. Dr. Hwang follows in the footsteps of Doctors Josh Pahys and Amer Samdani who received the award in 2017 and 2013, respectively. The Philadelphia hospital doctors continue to excel in their specialties.

It would also not be a Philadelphia report if I didn't thank the Nobles and Ladies of Acca for their support throughout the year. At the December board meeting, Noble Dave Eells and I had the pleasure of presenting checks totaling \$3,800 from Acca Shriners units and clubs. Special thanks to the Nobles and Ladies of the Piedmont Shrine Club, Hopewell Shrine Club, Oriental Band, Legion of Honor, Sauerkrauts Band, and Million Dollar Band for your generosity!

Finally, at its November meeting, the Board of Trustees elected the officers and members of the Philadelphia Board of Governors for the upcoming year. I am honored and humbled to be re-elected as Chairman of the Board for 2023. The other officers are, Vice Chairman Noble Chris Ritchey (Jaffa Shriners), Secretary Noble Tom Spoltore (Lulu Shriners), and Treasurer, Henry Haughey (Crescent Shriners). It is truly an honor and privilege to lead all of the dedicated Shriners who serve on the Board of Governors. I am proud to report that collectively the Philadelphia BOG, directly and indirectly, contributed over \$500,000 to the Philadelphia hospital in 2022.

By the time you read this, Vice Chairman Ritchey and I, along with the hospital leadership team, will have attended the annual leadership conference in Tampa. I will update you in the next installment.

Noble Dave Eells and I are honored to serve on the Philadelphia Hospital Board of Governors and represent Acca Shriners in that capacity. As always, thanks to all Acca Nobles and Ladies for your continued support and commitment to Shriners Children's Philadelphia and the World's Greatest Philanthropy. 
