If the prosthetic is complicated, it may take a couple of days.

Welcome to Accaba Court, and we all look forward to working with each of you as you start your LOS journey. All activities are now back to pre-Covid levels. Our Outreach Clinics are open in Okatie, SC, and in Hendersonville, NC. A new clinic will be opening in Spartanburg, SC this fall.

Two new pediatric orthopedic surgeons are being added to the staff in anticipation of the retirement of two of our current surgeons. The retirements will probably occur later this year or early next year.

Here are our statistics for 2022 and are excellent, particularly considering the fact we still had some Covid restrictions for about the first half of the year.

85+ different orthopedic conditions treated

Patients were served from 38 states and 20 foreign countries!

Clinic Visits – 14,283 Surgical Procedures – 1,201 Prosthetic and orthotic deliveries – 6,445 Radiology exams – 18,550 Rehabilitation Procedures – 21,268 Motion Analysis Studies – 791 Telehealth Visits – 2,034 Miles traveled by Roadrunners – 728, 616

The Shrine System is starting to place more emphasis on international patients and treatment of those patients in their own countries. Surgeons and nursing personnel have made two trips to El Salvador to operate and teach. One of our surgeons, Dr. Westberry, has participated in a similar teaching capacity in Cyprus. This program will be expanded this year.

He previously served at Christiana Hospital in Newark, Delaware as director of clinical operations, perioperative services. He also served at Penn Presbyterian Medical Center, in Philadelphia, as director of medical/surgical nursing. Greg spent nearly seven years in various roles at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania, in Philadelphia. What impressed me and the selection committee members most during his interview was his communication style and passion for our mission.

Greg reported aboard on March 6 and was officially



introduced to the Board of Governors at our March 16 meeting. During that meeting, the Board recognized Krista Miller for her outstanding leadership while serving three years as Interim Administrator. Krista was also congratulated on her appointment as Northeast Market Director of Patient Care Services/ Nurse Executive. Megan Hauser, our Human Resources Director, was also congratulated on her selection as the Northeast Market Human Resources Director. Both Krista and Megan will be based at our hospital.

As if that was not enough excitement for the month, I received a text message from Greg on the morning of March 27 that the Joint Commission Survey team had arrived for its "unannounced full event." This is a triennial accreditation survey and is a very big deal! The Joint Commission is an independent, notfor-profit group in the United States that administers voluntary accreditation programs for hospitals and other healthcare organizations. The commission develops performance standards that address crucial elements of operation, such as patient care, medication safety, infection control and consumer rights. The lead surveyor was extremely complimentary of our staff and could not say enough about the quality of care. During her interview with me, she shared that there are three characteristics of highly reliable healthcare organizations—leadership commitment, process improvement, and safety—and that she personally observed each of those characteristics during her two days at the hospital. While we will not receive the final report for several weeks, there were no conditional findings so we will not have a return visit for three years. It was an excellent survey and I am very proud of the team.

We've experienced a return to normal in April. The primary focus now is on our Puerto Rico outreach clinic. After a three-year delay caused by hurricanes and COVID, the Puerto Rico clinic is being planned for May 20 and 21. This clinic has been a semi-annual event for the Philadelphia team since 1964 and we are excited to reconnect with those patients and their families. We are also excited about a new location. This year, the clinic will be held at Orlando Health

in Dorado, Puerto Rico, about 15 miles west of San Juan. We are continuing to partner with Al Rai'e Saleh Shriners and I am looking forward to seeing the Nobles and Ladies I met when last there in 2019.

While I could go on, I will sign off for now. Noble Dave Eells and I are honored to serve on the Philadelphia Hospital Board of Governors and represent Acca Shriners in that capacity. Please let either of us know if you have any questions about the hospital and especially if you know of a child who could benefit from Shriners care. As always, thanks to all Acca Nobles and Ladies for your continued support and commitment to Shriners Children's Philadelphia and the World's Greatest Philanthropy. 
Provost Guard

Planning for the Acca Hospital Committee and Transportation Team began in 1998 under the leadership of Illustrious Potentate Ray C. Goodwin and a number of committees. In 2000 Illustrious James A. McAllister and the Acca Nobility established the Acca Hospital Committee and Transportation Team. The committee started with (70) children on the active patient rosters at the Greenville, Philadelphia, and Cincinnati hospitals. Acca conducted a fundraising program and purchased its first transportation van in 2000 and a second van in 2005. Today the Roadrunners have over (30) drivers, both Nobles and Ladies and two transportation vans. Many dedicated Nobles, Ladies, friends and donors support the Roadrunners and the Transportation Fund with their participation and generous contributions. Shriners Children's three-part mission has one goal: to change and improve lives by providing compassionate, innovative care; conducting research; and offering educational opportunities. The mission helps Shriners Children's transform the lives of children and families around the world. Patients receive world class, life-changing treatment regardless of their family's ability to pay.

Today the Hospital Committee, hospital representatives and Roadrunners continue their philanthropic work by serving on the board of directors for Greenville and Philadelphia Hospitals and transporting patients from around Virginia to Shriners Hospitals for Children.
