Golf Club


The "Acca Swingers" Golf Club is having another memorable year. We have played many of the best golf courses in the area and our schedule is only half complete.


Acca Shriners Fall Ceremonial and Potentate's Ball Honors Illustrious Al and Lady Bette Rock November 17 – 18, 2023

Summer Update



Greenville Hospital Report

Richard "Doc" Redman



The Shriners system has been reorganized into regions and the Greenville Administrator, Bill Munley, has been designated as the Southeast Region Administrator. In addition to his new position, he will continue as the Greenville administrator.

The orthopedic surgeons for the Shrine system have formed the Shriners Children's Medical Group and our Chief of Staff, Dr Wattenbarger, will become the President of the group. This group is the largest pediatric orthopedic group in the world. Dr. Westberry will become our new Chief of Staff. Three new surgeons will be joining the staff. I will share more information about them in our next edition.

For the third straight year we have been honored with recognition by the Best of the Upstate awards. Greenville was recognized as Best Orthopedic Center, Best Pediatric Clinic and Best Hospital. We were chosen out of all the medical facilities in the northern half of South Carolina. These are considered very prestigious awards.

The entire Shriners system is beginning to focus more on international patients. Greenville currently is seeing patients from 25 foreign countries with 39 patients scheduled for appointments or procedures. There are another 88 in the

"pipeline" waiting for appointments. Surgeons and other support personnel are traveling to other countries helping train surgeons, nurses and physical therapists so that more procedures can be done locally and save on transportation and other factors. Surgeons from Greenville have been to El Salvador and Cyprus. More of these trips have been scheduled.

Ill Sir Dennis Berry and I thank you for allowing us to represent Acca on the Greenville Board of Governors.

Philadelphia Hospital Report

Greetings from Philadelphia and Hola from Puerto Rico! It's been a busy summer, so I'll get right to it!!

After a three-year delay caused by hurricanes and COVID, a 44-person team (myself included), from Shriners Children's Philadelphia returned to Puerto Rico for an outreach clinic held on May 20 and 21. The clinic has been a semi-annual event for the Philadelphia team since 1964 and the team was excited to reconnect with patients and their families. This year, the clinic was held at Orlando Health in Dorado, Puerto Rico, about 15 miles west of San Juan. It's a beautiful, brandnew facility, designed by the architect who designed the Ritz Carlton in Dorado Beach. It certainly felt more like a hotel than a hospital! Despite the 3-year hiatus, our brethren of Al Rai'e Saleh Shriners didn't miss a beat and provided invaluable volunteer support. In addition to logistic support-moving our equipment from the port to storage, to the hospital and back, and providing bus transportation for the hospital teamthey worked as interpreters, assisted with patient processing, and did anything else asked of them! I am proud to be, as was the late Noble David Eells, associate members of Al Rai'e Saleh.

The Puerto Rico clinic was a huge success and a perfect example of Shriners Children's providing 'The Most Amazing Care Anywhere!' There were 279 scheduled clinical appointments and 31 walkins: 109 prosthetic and orthotics visits; 35 physical therapy visits; 29 occupational therapy visits; and 63 wheelchair fittings. Additionally, to round out our tripartite mission which includes education and research, medical and physical therapy students shadowed our practitioners on both days and 45 subjects provided 105 DNA samples for research. It's always good to impress your boss and we did! Imperial Potentate and Chairman of the Board of Directors of Shriners Children's, Kenny Craven, his Lady Jennifer, and John McCabe, Executive Vice President, Chief Operating Officer, paid us an unexpected visit Saturday morning and saw the team in full stride!

Numbers are impressive, but they don't begin to tell the story of how these clinics change our patients'

and their families' lives for the better. While we all experienced many tear inducing moments during the two-day clinic, one story shared with me by Dr. Terry Ishmael, particularly touched me. Terry was completing an initial evaluation of a young boy when mom broke down into tears. When she composed herself, she said, "Thank you! This is first time anyone has given us a care plan for our son."

Back on the mainland, it was my personal honor to host High Priestess Debbie Bartol of our own Accaba Court 105 and several of her Ladies at our June board meeting. We had a fun dinner at Miller's Alehouse on Wednesday night and the Ladies toured the hospital Thursday morning. Thank you for visiting, Ladies! The hospital is back open for tours, so please let Noble Dave or I know if any unit, club, or group would like to visit.

In July, Lady Gloria and I attended the Imperial Session in Charlotte. While there was not a lot of business for Colorado Corporation (Hospital) members to act on, the public sessions were impressive, we met the new international patient ambassadors (who are amazing!) and enjoyed a concert by award winning country music artist, Joe Nichols. But the true highlight of the session was spending time with Illustrious Sir Mike, Lady Nancy, and the rest of our Acca family!

Following our August board meeting, the hospital leadership team, board officers, and several board members traveled to Boston to participate in a Northeast Market Leadership conference. As you may recall from earlier articles, the Northeast Market consists of the Philadelphia and Boston hospitals and the Erie and Springfield clinics. Good presentations and excellent networking opportunities were the main takeaways from the two-day conference.

Looking ahead to the fall, the Joint Boards approved two additional Puerto Rico clinics; one in September to deliver wheelchairs, prosthetic and orthotic orders from the May clinic, and a second full clinic in November. The hospital's annual Walk for Love is coming up on Saturday, October 7, at the Philadelphia Zoo. This is the hospital's only fundraiser. While it may

be difficult to attend in person, I encourage you to participate virtually by joining my team, the "Board Walkers," at https://donate.lovetotherescue.org/team/502233. I sincerely appreciate your support!

I am honored to serve on the Philadelphia Hospital Board of Governors, as was the late Noble David Eells, and represent Acca in that capacity. Please let me know if you have any questions about the hospital and especially if you know of a child who could benefit from Shriners' care. As always, thanks to all Acca Nobles and Ladies for your continued support and commitment to Shriners Children's Philadelphia and the World's Greatest Philanthropy. Hospital Committee & Transportation Team

Noble Bill Ferguson, Chairman

Thank you for allowing me to serve in 2023 as the Chairman of the Acca Shriners Hospital Committee and manage the transportation needs of Shriner's Kids, our patients, to the various Shriners Children's hospitals and clinics. I was asked if this was like running a day care center, I responded it is more like a symphony orchestra, and I am the conductor. The dedicated drivers and committee members are my musicians and when they do their job, it is like beautiful music. Without them I would just be a single person, with a baton, in front of a quiet room. Nothing would get done!

I have been asked many times why Acca Shriners help patients and their families with the transportation to appointments for treatments at Shriners Children's hospitals and clinics. Why do we spend long hours driving our vans to help kids that we do not know? My first comment is that it is "The Feeling" that you get for providing these critically needed services. Yes, it is addictive, but not from drugs. Take a minute and close your eyes and think back. Picture in your mind how you felt when your child, grandchild or friend's child took their first steps. This feeling is as close as I can describe to explain how you feel when helping these kids.

My first story is about a dear little girl, and I must be very careful not to break any HIPA or Privacy Rules which govern what I can say. Her story starts before she was even born. Her mother suspected that there was a problem with spina bifida affecting her unborn child. Her brother had this condition, so there was a possibility that her unborn child could be affected. They ran a test and confirmed her fears. At six months into her pregnancy, she went to Childrens Hospital of Philadelphia where the fetus was removed from her uterus, surgery was performed to correct the problem and then returned to uterus, so she could carry the child to term. The mother stayed in the hospital for three months until she delivered her child who was then referred to Shriners Children's Hospital in Philadelphia. The little girl became a regular transport patient to and from the hospital and spoke at Acca telling her story. One day while I was dealing with my wife's medical problems, I received a

text video from the mother. It was a video of the child taking her first steps. It made me feel like all the trips, time and effort were worthwhile. I keep this video on my phone and watch it from time to time for inspiration and to remind me of the important services that Shriners provide. We change lives.

When I first started this job, I was sitting on the patio with my wife when the phone rang, it was an Acca Shriner. He asked me if I could call a young lady about a medical problem with her child and could the Shriner's Childrens possibly help her. I called the number, and a young girl answered. She was crying and with a great sense of desperation she told me the story of how she had given birth to a little girl, six days old, that was born with clubbed hands and feet. The hospital told her that "because she had no medical insurance, they could not treat her child and take her home." I immediately called Noble Richard Redman, M.D., who serves on the Acca Hospital Committee and asked him to call the child's mother and determine if treatment is available at a Shriners Children's hospital. I looked up to see tears running down my wife's face as she could feel the pain this young girl was going through. About two hours later the young mother called back saying that her child had been accepted as a patient at the Shriners Children's Greenville hospital, but she had a problem. She did not own a car and had no means of transportation to travel from Norfolk to the hospital. I told her not to worry, I would talk to our brothers at the Khedive Shriners in Chesapeake, VA who would gladly transport them to the hospital. Khedive started transporting her and I received regular notes of her appointments from the hospital. About a year ago I was carrying a patient from Richmond to Greenville and stopped for lunch at the Smithfield Barbeque restaurant in Henderson NC. Drivers from all the Shrine Centers pass around the names of good restaurants in our price range, so it is not unusual to run into other Shriners at the same restaurants. The Khedive van was in the parking lot when we arrived. When we went into the restaurant, I noticed the drivers were with a mother and a little girl. After finishing their lunch, I saw

the little girl in her walker heading to the van with the Khedive drivers. She was not fast, but she was getting there. The mother approached us and asked if we were from Acca, and I replied yes. She asked if I knew a guy named Bill Ferguson. I replied, "That's me." She gave me a big hug and thanked me for I was the one on the other end of the phone that day on the patio when she had all but given up hope. I had "The Feeling" as I watched the little girl get into the Khedive van.

My job and responsibilities have rewards and challenges. The other day we received a patient referral from a local children's hospital which is not unusual. I listened to the information on the patient from the hospital but at the end of the conversation the case worker said, "Oh by the way. the mother only speaks Swahili." My comment was "this should be interesting." It turns out that the patient is a teenager in the Henrico County school system and is bilingual. I just call him after 3:00 PM when he gets home from school, and we work out the hospital trip details — in English.

If you would like to have "The Feeling" there are two ways to do that. First volunteer and become a driver. You will need to fill out the proper paperwork and be approved. Second, donate to the Acca Transportation Fund which is a 501(c)(3) charitable organization and is tax deductible. Donations to Acca Transportation Fund dropped off drastically during COVID and have not rebounded to keep pace with rising transportation costs. Every dollar given to the Acca Transportation Fund is spent carefully and used to pay for the necessary transportation costs for our patients to travel to Shriners Children's hospitals and clinics for treatments. There is a statue in from of Acca Shrine center of a Shriner carrying a child. There is a saying that goes along the statue that says "no man stands so tall as when he stoops to help a child." How tall are you?

Mike Lott, our 2023 Acca Potentate, reminds us to:

- Be the reason that someone believes in themselves.
- Be the reason that someone has dreams.
- Be the reason that someone knows that there is goodness,
 - And encouragement and love in this world.

Shriners and Ladies provide the resources that allow kids to dream and believe about mobility, to stand, to walk, use their arms and hands, speak without a clef palate, and restore their burned body. A dream that had been unimaginable to many of them. We show our love with hundreds of volunteer hours and our financial support.

Transportation Fund

Donations to the Transportation Fund are not keeping pace with expenses this year. The Transportation Fund pays the expenses for patients to travel to Shriners Children's Hospitals and Clinics for treatment. It is funded locally by grassroots support from our community and the efforts of Acca Shriners' hard work. The Transportation Fund does not receive funds from Shriners Children's or Shriners International.

We continue to add new patients that increase our transportation expenses. Several patients require air travel to access services in a specialized Shriners Children's Hospital. These costs are in addition to our normal transportation operating expenses, which have also increased significantly since the end of COVID restrictions and the full reopening of Shriners Hospitals.

We have a patient from Richmond with Brittle Bone. The patient was evaluated by the Philadelphia Hospital, and we are waiting to find out if they will be transferred to Montreal. Angel flight does not fly to Montreal, so plans are to fly the patient and parent by commercial air at about \$2,000 a trip plus lodging and meals.

Saint Louis Shriner's Hospital will treat a patient from our area that was referred by the VCU Children's Hospital. In the next three months, three trips are planned to the Saint Louis Hospital, one will be a month-long stay at the hospital and lodging. The cost of airfare will run approximately \$2,000 per trip or \$6,000 total cost. If you add \$4,000 for hotel and food costs, this patient will add \$10,000 to our expenses.

A patient from King George will travel to Philadelphia to undergo spinal surgery followed by an 8-week plus stay with Halo treatment. Hopefully, we can get them into Ronald McDonald house at \$15.00 a night or approximately \$2,000. We can furnish a food card to the cafeteria which averages \$15.00 a day or about \$2,000. This patient could add about \$4,000 to our expenses.

The average cost of a Shriner-driven trip in our hospital vans is about \$1,200 per trip. You can see from the financial summary below, coupled with the unexpected expenses detailed above, we need your help to get the children to our hospitals. Shriners Children's provide world-class, innovative medical services to children in need regardless of their ability to pay. This includes transportation, lodging for the family, and meals. We estimate that we will spend \$80,000 in 2023 to cover patient transportation expenses.

HELP US REDUCE ACCALETTE EXPENSES

Dear Nobles, Ladies and Friends of Acca Shriners:

The Board of Directors is taking steps to make sure our finances are being well managed. Much has been done to reduce wasteful spending and control expenses by reviewing our spending habits, contractual agreements, and compensation offerings.

We realize the Accalette is a quality publication that many of you enjoy. However, costs of publication and mailing run from \$12,000 to \$15,000 annually. When the publication is delivered to the U.S. Post Office for bulk mail distribution it can take weeks before it reaches the reader. That and the fact we have already reduced the number of issues to save cost can make the news in the magazine old news. We feel our best method of communication with the membership is through email and telephone.

Consideration was given to making the Accalette a digital publication only, but we recognize that some of our members would not be able to receive it in this manner. Therefore, we ask for your help. He was also treated in Dayton and Chicago Shriners. He revealed his appreciation to Shriners at the end of the evening, when he matched the \$250, we had placed in the bucket with his \$250! The Leaf and Barrel was able to donate \$501 to our Transportation Fund. The extra dollar was the "seed money" placed before we started contributing. We all had a great time, and plan to revisit Griffin Cigar very soon.

As Autumn approaches we realize that 4th Fridays interfere with many Holidays and have decided to combine our September and October meetings and meet at the Activity Center starting on Friday, October 6th.

Every year, Shriners Children's™ selects a pair of International Patient Ambassadors to represent the healthcare system's patients. The ambassadors share their stories of perseverance and the ways Shriners Children's has made a difference in their lives. We are honored to have these impressive young people advocating for our healthcare system.

GIANNA

Gianna, 15, was born with a rare condition called proximal femoral focal deficiency (PFFD), which caused her to be missing part of her left femur. Her parents knew they had to find the right specialized care for their daughter, and were grateful to learn that the orthopedic team at Shriners Children's Southern California had the expertise to treat PFFD.

Gianna's left leg was shorter than her right one, and she faced hip malformations and other congenital left extremity limb deficiencies, said Robert Cho, M.D., pediatric orthopedic surgeon and chief of staff at Shriners Children's Southern California. "Gianna did not have a functional knee joint, and she had a non-functioning foot that was pointed inward. It would have been essentially impossible for her to walk without amputating that and giving her a prosthesis," Dr. Cho said.

Gianna had her first visit at Shriners Children's when she was 3 months old, and at 9 months, she received her first prosthesis.

As Gianna grew older she became aware of her physical differences and at times struggled with her self-image. With the unwavering love and support of her family and her care team at Shriners Children's, she developed

the confidence to embrace life. The prosthetics and rehabilitation teams worked with Gianna to teach her how to adapt and build the skills to meet her physical challenges.

"My Shriners Children's family taught me to never let my leg hold me back from being the best version of myself," she said.

Now Gianna is an active high school student who is both an artist and an athlete. She is an avid sports fan and keeps busy by competing in tennis and golf. She especially loves football, and her favorite team is the Kansas City Chiefs. Her dream is to be the commissioner of the NFL someday. With her drive and spirit, Dr. Cho has every confidence that Gianna can achieve what she sets her mind to

Gianna's father was so impressed with the care his daughter received he was inspired to become a Shriner and currently serves as chairman of the Board of Governors at Shriners Children's Southern California. "I'm so proud of my dad. I'm glad that he has found a brotherhood and a community. Just as I have found support, he has, as well," said Gianna.

'Shriners Children's was there for me when I needed them," said Gianna. "I wouldn't be where I am today without them. Being an International Patient Ambassador gives me the opportunity to show my gratitude for Shriners Children's. I want to inspire and encourage kids just like me and let them know that the limits are endless. All they have to do is try!

JUAN DIEGO

Juan Diego, 18, was burned in an electrical accident when he was 13, leaving his hands seriously disfigured. He spent more than a month in the hospital in Honduras. When he returned home, he was completely dependent on others for even the most basic tasks. He could not take care of himself, go to school, or draw or play music, two of his passions.

The Ruth Paz Foundation, a non-profit organization in Honduras devoted to providing quality medical services to children, learned about Juan Diego's burn injury and connected him with Shriners Children's Boston. Four months after his injury, he arrived at the hospital in Boston. Some of his burn wounds were still open, requiring immediate attention from the acute burn team. Juan Diego knew the road ahead was going to be challenging, but he approached every day, every treatment and every obstacle with a positive attitude.

During his two and a half months in Boston in 2018, much of Juan Diego's treatment involved intensive physical and occupational therapy. He worked with therapists at least five days a week, sometimes multiple times a day. Occupational therapist Courtney Updegrove fabricated customized splints for his hands, enabling Juan Diego to relearn how to care for himself. He was even able to draw and play the drums again.

Along with his traditional therapy sessions, Juan Diego was a member of Team Brave, the hospital's community reintegration program and competed in a Spartan Race as part of Team No Limits. He was also one of five patients who attended Game 1 of the World Series. He says it is a night he will never forget. Juan Diego transferred to the reconstructive phase of his care where Joseph Upton, M.D., a plastic surgeon hand specialist, was able to restore sensation and mobility by taking tissue from another part of Juan Diego's body and building a web space between his thumb and index finger. Juan Diego continues to

come to Shriners Children's Boston for reconstructive and laser surgeries to improve the function and mobility of his hands.

With every improvement, Juan Diego is able to do more of what he loves. From art and music to so many sports - soccer, football, tennis and ping-pong, Juan Diego keeps very busy. He would even love to go to the Paralympics to compete in ping-pong someday. "I should probably start practicing!" he laughed.

Now a college student in Honduras studying international relations, Juan Diego is honored to represent Shriners Children's as an international patient ambassador.

"I want to put into action all of the gratitude I have for Shriners Children's and those who have helped me since my injury," he said. "I hope my story brings inspiration and hope to others."
